HIGHLIGHTS

Professional development training & workshops

OY are making a commitment to the sector to help Changemakers increase their skills and knowledge to provide the best support to children and young people.

OY are working on a schedule of events that cover issues that impact young people such as drugs & alcohol, sexual health, knife crime, county lines, LGBTQI+, FGM, homelessness and much more.

In 2022-2023, OY are asking organisations in the network to make a commitment to attend these events so that every young person in the county has access to a trusted adult who is informed in issues that affect them.

The next page details of events that have already been confirmed, and they are free or highly subsidised to those in the network.

Partnership meeting & socials

Every quarter, OY will host a meeting in which each Changemaker is invited to celebrate their achievements and share future plans. This allows the whole network to stay in the know, build partnerships and gain opportunities for their young people.

Many Changemakers have expressed an interest in having time with peers from the Network to discuss struggles outside of work. The Socials are a safe space where members can talk to others in the network in an informal and judgement-free setting.

Directory & calendar

One of the strengths of the Network is the members themselves. For those who opt in, OY will put together a directory with details and contact information.

OY are hoping to produce a shared calendar on the website where members can post activities, and see what others are hosting.

Core modules

Workshops include The Principles of Youth Work, Planning & Evaluating Youth Work Sessions, Understanding Behaviour that Challenges, Having Difficult Conversations and An Introduction to Group Work Skills.

These sessions allow those new to the sector to explore and reflect on their practice and those who have more experience to revisit the basics of youth work.

PLANNED TRAINING & PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT EVENTS

Children & young people's mental health awareness

One session per quarter, each course is covered online between 4-7pm and is free to members.

On 30th June and 1st July, we are hosting a 2-day Mental Health First Aid Training. MHFA England put the cost of this training at £300pp. We are offering this at a cost of £65pp to individuals from within the Changemaker Network.

Spaces are limited.

Professional development events

On May 19th, Terrance Higgins Trust will deliver a session on Young People's Sexual Health.

Oxford Against Cutting will deliver an online session on Honour Based Abuse on June 7th.

A session on Trauma Informed Practice will be run by PaceUK in May.

This is a small selection, OY are organising a number of events and can provide more details on request.
